GET CHEESY

Visit a cheesemaker at ONE of the following locations and take a photo of yourself visiting the cheesemaker/business location to complete this clue:

(1) A cheesemaker's farmstand or store. You can find cheesemakers' farmstands/ stores on the Vermont Cheese Trail here: https://vtcheese.com/vermont-cheese-trail-map. Please note: Not all makers have farmstands/are open to the public - so do be sure you are visiting one that is labeled "open" on the trail map or uses the 'cheese wedge' icon - which means they are open to visitors IF you call ahead. Using the trail map, you can find their phone numbers to do just that; we recommend calling at least a day in advance if possible - and a few sites may


give you a site tour if you call/plan ahead too (it never hurts to ask!). OR ...

(2) At a local farmers markets. Find a market here: https://nofavt.org/find-organic-local-food/farmers-markets.

Insider tip: We recommend reviewing the market online/asking them via email to make sure a cheesemaker is at the market. Not all have cheesemakers present!



CLUE 8

PICNIC TIME...

This region is rich in waterways - rivers, creeks, reservoirs, lakes, and ponds. Find a water spot to enjoy your picnic - either on the water or alongside it! Whether reflecting on the water or canoeing/kayaking/stand up paddling - take a photo of your experience to complete this clue.

Insider Tip #1: Local rental locations for kayaks, canoes, and SUPs: Little River State Park; Umiak Outdoor Outfitters at Waterbury Reservoir: https://www.umiak.com/summer-activities If you are a beginner - please let your rental folks know - and they should be able to provide you with great "starting out" tips and information!

Insider Tip #2: If you do this clue by mid-October, you can swing by the Waitsfield Farmers Market on any Saturday (open through October 16th 9am-1pm) or the Stowe Farmers Market on any Sunday (open through October 10th 10:30am-3pm) to grab some local cheese to take on your adventure!

Insider Tip #3: If you are a VT resident, don't forget that your local library may offer free passes to access state parks (note: if you rent equipment, you may still have a rental fee).







TAKE IN THE VIEW

Grab your favorite cheese (or coffee and breakfast - or an end of day happy hour snack) and head out to enjoy your meal or snack with a view! Take a picture of yourself at one of the spots below to complete this clue:

(a) Visit Stowe's Sunset Rock and/or Upper Overlook trails for a lower key option that has more easily accessible trails and views! With options for a short walk or with more nearby parking - it's a great low-key experience for all!

(b) For the more experienced hiker who is OK with slippery rock surfaces, wind on exposed rock faces, and uncertain hiking conditions: Head up Mt. Mansfield. You can reach this by

gondola, hiking up from the bottom, or car/toll road.

And we recommend calling the toll road phone number to learn what conditions at the top of Mt. Mansfield are before heading up. It can sometimes be clearer at the bottom and misty, wet, and fogged in at the top! Still beautiful - but worth knowing about before you head up!





SEE SOMETHING UNIQUE

Take a break beside the West Branch River at the stone gazebo on Stowe's outdoor recreation path. This beautiful spot can only be reached by walking, running, or cycling on the recreation path.

To complete this clue: Take a photo of yourself at this peaceful stop!

Hint: This gazebo may be found between the Luce Hill Rd. parking area and the path's northern terminus! Though it takes some effort to get there, it is a truly peaceful spot to experience - just to sit at, to enjoy coffee and the paper for a slower moment to your day, to nibble your way through a lunch picnic .- really for anything!
