

GET CHEESY

Visit a cheesemaker at ONE of the following locations and take a photo of yourself visiting the cheesemaker/ business location to complete this clue:

(1) A cheesemaker's farmstand or store. You can find cheesemakers' farmstands/ stores on the Vermont Cheese Trail here: https://vtcheese.com/vermont-cheesetrail-map. Please note: Not all makers have farmstands/are open to the public - so do be sure you are visiting one that is labeled "open" on the trail map or uses the 'cheese wedge' icon - which means they are open to visitors IF you call ahead. Using the trail map, you can find their phone numbers to do just that; we recommend calling at least a day in advance if possible - and a few sites may

give you a site tour if you call/plan ahead too (it never hurts to ask!). OR ...

(2) At a local farmers markets. Find a market here: <u>https://nofavt.org/findorganic-local-food/farmers-markets</u>. *Insider tip: We recommend reviewing the market online/asking them via email to make sure a cheesemaker is at the market. Not all have cheesemakers present!*

PICNIC TIME...

Do one of the following activities, taking along some of your favorite Vermont cheese to picnic. To complete this clue - take a picture of you and your cheese on your adventure!

CLUE

- Go for the view: Climb, drive, or take a gondola up to the top of the ski capital of the east
- Visit the water: This region is packed with streams, creeks, and swimming holes; pick one for your picnic, either on a shore or watercraft of some type!
- Meander the Stowe Rec Path: Walk or pedal along the Stowe Recreation Path, stopping for picnic and/or snack along the way! Path info: https://www.stowerec.org/parks-facilities/recpaths/stowe-recreation-path/

Insider Tip #3: If you are a VT resident, don't forget that your local library may offer free passes to access state parks (note: if you rent or use facility equipment, you may still have a rental fee).





Grab your favorite cheese (or coffee and breakfast - or an end of day happy hour snack) and head out to enjoy your meal or snack with a view! Visit Stowe's Sunset Rock and/or Upper Overlook trails for a lower key option that has more easily accessible trails and views! With options for a short walk or with more nearby parking - it's a great low-key experience for all!
