


INSTRUCTIONS You must complete:

DURATION This packet is a good fit for those looking for a day trip around the region - estimated to take 3-6 hours to complete for anyone starting in this region, with longer duration for anyone doing longer outdoor adventures. For those pursuing the longer hikes/bike rides, planning for two days may be more appropriate.

GET CHEESY

Visit a cheesemaker at ONE of the following locations and take a photo of yourself visiting the cheesemaker/business location to complete this clue:

(1) A cheesemaker's farmstand or store. You can find cheesemakers' farmstands/ stores on the Vermont Cheese Trail here: https://vtcheese.com/vermont-cheese-trail-map. Please note: Not all makers have farmstands/are open to the public - so do be sure you are visiting one that is labeled "open" on the trail map or uses the 'cheese wedge' icon - which means they are open to visitors IF you call ahead. Using the trail map, you can find their phone numbers to do just that; we recommend calling at least a day in advance if possible - and a few sites may

give you a site tour if you call/plan ahead too (it never hurts to ask!). OR ...

(2) At a local farmers markets. Find a market here: https://nofavt.org/find-organic-local-food/farmers-markets.

Insider tip: We recommend reviewing the market online/asking them via email to make sure a cheesemaker is at the market. Not all have cheesemakers present!



A PAIRED EXPERIENCE

Grab a Vermont cheese and visit the site of an organization that produces something that pairs with cheese! This can be chocolate maker, apple orchard, cider producer, wine maker, brewery, jam maker, etc. To complete this clue: Take a pic of your cheese and this pairing location (or a paired item you tried there) and tell us where you visited!

Visit the Cow Tunnel at Retreat Farm in Brattleboro.

To complete this clue: Take a pic of at least one team member there!

FIND IT...

Visit a local cheese shop (see list earlier in our clue packet of where to go) and find a Vermont cheesemaker or Vermont cheese whose name contains BOTH

- (a) the LAST LETTER of any team member's FIRST NAME and
- (b) the FIRST LETTER of any team member's FIRST NAME.

To complete this clue: Share a pic of a team member with the cheese you found!

(Tell the store you're in that you're there to do The Vermont Cheese Council's Cheese Hunt they like knowing we sent you there!)

Not a requirement - but fun: Eat your cheesily named companion...the cheese, not the person.



GET ARTY

Pick one:

(1) Head to the Path of Life Sculpture Garden in Windsor! Take a pic with your favorite sculpture/item in the garden to complete this clue! Is it the giant sculpture people? The maze? Please check the website for hours and know that there is a fee to enter - Last we checked, this was: \$6 for 13+, \$3 for ages 3-12, free for those under 3. Insider tip: Towns all along I-91 in this region of Vermont are packed with great cooperative grocery stores – all of which

have a great selection of locally-made cheeses! Find them and other spots to get cheese using the listing in the beginning of this clue packet.

(2) Visit the bronze giants of Randolph: The tails of Whale Dance. This sculpture by Jim Sardonis is one of few spots where you can stand alongside two giant whales' tails while looking out on the mountains here in Vermont. Take a photo of yourself with these giants to complete this clue!



LEG STRETCH & LEARNING STOP

Explore the Upper Connecticut River Valley area of this region by doing ONE of the following:

- 1. Hike Eagle's Bluff from the Cross Rivendell Trail and get a birds eye view of Lake Morey. Neat fact: Lake Morey has the longest plowed outdoor skating loop in the US in winter.
- 2. Stroll through the woods to find the Grand Canyon of Norwich.
- 3. Take a paddle on the Connecticut River and look for eagles or herons. Dartmouth Outdoor Club offers canoe and kayak rentals.

To complete this clue: Take a picture of your team on this adventure!



PICNIC TIME...

Pack up some Vermont cheese for this one!

Enjoy the shade of sugar maples and 400-yearold hemlocks, while you pass through covered bridges and alongside rambling stone walls - by visiting Vermont's only national park!

To complete this clue: Walk its gardens, climb up to its south peak, loop the pogue, or find another way to enjoy this beautiful landscape - and take a picture of at least one team member with your cheese on your adventure!

Insider tip: There are many places to swing by and grab cheese in this region; to find one, consult the list of places to find cheese that is at the start of your clue packet!



TAKE IN THE VIEW

Solve my riddle below and a pic at my top from the road or take the 1/2 mile trail to the bottom to take a pic from the rocks to complete this clue.

At around 165 feet,


I'm the deepest of my kind,
